2011 GETTY UNDERGRADUATE MULTICULTURAL SUMMER INTERNSHIPS AT CSPG

The Center for the Study of Political Graphics (CSPG) is an educational and research archive that collects, preserves, documents, and circulates domestic and international political posters relating to historical and contemporary movements for social change. Through its programs, CSPG is reclaiming the power of art to educate and inspire people to action.

CSPG has been awarded a grant from the Getty Grant Program to hire two undergraduate students for summer internships. Interns are given a stipend of \$3,500 for a full-time ten-week period between May 30 and August 19, 2011.

Qualification & Eligibility Requirements:

Getty internships are intended specifically for outstanding students who are members of groups underrepresented in professions related to museums and the visual arts: individuals of African American, Asian, Latino/a/ Hispanic, Native American, and Pacific Islander descent. Previous experience in the arts is not required. **(1)** S/he must be a currently enrolled undergraduate and have completed at least one semester of college by June 2011; **(2)** s/he must be a resident of or attend college in Los Angeles County.

Students who have previously served as Getty Multicultural Summer Interns at our organization are not eligible for consideration.

Required:

- Working experience with Microsoft Office programs
- Strong visual interpretation and research skills

Preferred:

Familiarity with foreign languages

Experience in digital photography, graphic design, Adobe design programs and Dreamweaver.

Job Description:

The interns will receive training on some or all of the following projects:

1. Catalogue and data entry for political graphics using a museum database program.
2. Prepare digital images to be linked to database records.
3. Upload online exhibitions.
4. Research artistic and social justice issues as they relate to works in the collection.
5. Prepare posters for exhibitions.
6. Assist the Program Director with tasks related to arts management, fundraising, and producing promotional materials.
